And inconvenience there is! Delays, stranded passengers, disruption of airline operations with knock-on effects sometimes thousands of miles away. Airport shutdowns also impact the economic activity of a whole region. And then there is the hassle of putting everything back into gear once the airport reopens! Tempelhof airport closed down in October 2008 and has recently been transformed into Germany's largest shelter for migrants to help alleviate the Syrian refugee crisis. This is a rather extreme outcome as most of the time airports are only temporarily shut down or partially closed. It can happen for a number of reasons, predictable or not: restricted operational hours, weather, accidents, technical problems, work in progress, strikes, demonstrations by local residents, suspicion of terrorist activity, special events such as airshows or competitions, wildlife incursions, FODs.
