IT WAS SUPPOSED TO BE THE ADVENT OF SPRING ... BUT NOBODY TOLD THE WEATHER MAN

What is spring, exactly? The first answer that comes to mind is that spring is the transition season between winter and summer. It begins on the vernal, or spring, equinox - from the latin «equi» meaning «equal» and «nox» meaning «night» - when the length of day and night is nearly equal. It ends with the summer solstice, around June 21st. The vernal equinox this year in the Northern Hemisphere was on Tuesday, March 20th at 16:15 UTC. This definition corresponds to the astronomical spring. There are others, such as the meteorological spring, which starts on March 1st and lasts through March, April and May. In some countries, for example Finland, seasons are defined by daily mean temperatures and their lengths vary greatly from north to south and from year to year. Also, keep in mind that in the Southern Hemisphere the seasons are reversed.
